# Purpose and structure of research proposal



# Background

- Literature review
- Can lead to your research question
- $\circ$  Is linked to significance

- ✓ Tip 1: Ask your Faculty Librarian
- ✓ Tip 2: Attend GRASP Research Proposal session 5 & 6
- ✓ Tip 3: Think of the method (*how will I do this*)
- ✓ Tip 4: Use visual tools



# Significance

- o Demonstrates importance and contribution to what is known
- $\circ$  Why are you excited about it?

# **Research question(s), aim, objectives**

- What is your research about what are you trying to do.
- Different for each project

- ✓ Tip 1: Use active verbs: propose, create, construct, demonstrate, define, establish, differentiate
- ✓ Tip 2: Attend GRASP Research Proposal session 2

#### **Methodology and methods**

- How can we know anything? What is true, what is sure, how can we know for sure... ontology, epistemology
- How will you answer your research question(s) methods
- Includes data analysis
- Leads into ethical considerations

✓ Tip: Attend GRASP Research Proposal session 3

#### **Ethical issues**

- What ethical issues might arise
- o ... and how will you deal with them.

 Tip: Consult your supervisor once you have worked out your methodology, and talk about ethics
