**Commodity Reports are useful if you are investigating an industry which focuses on commodities such as gold, sugar or other raw materials.**

Within the **Industry and Market Research Collection**, there are four choices, but only two are regularly updated - Business Monitor International and First Research:

1. **Business Monitor International (BMI) Reports:** Within the BMI Reports Collection, it is possible to browse by subject (industry-type) or location. A range of industries are covered, and the reports will often include **5-year forecasts** and **SWOT analyses**. However, the collection is dated.
2. **First Research:** The First Research Collection is browsed by subject/industry. The profiles created by market-research company Dun & Bradstreet are **global**; they don't focus on the operation or performance of an industry in relation to any specific country. This could be useful if you're interested in the bigger picture.

The **Commodity Reports Collection** focuses on data relating to raw materials or agricultural products. These reports, in both the Economist Intelligence Unit Collections and the Oxford Economics Commodity Price Forecasts are produced by date.

You will not find detailed information about each commodity, but you will find figures regarding past performance as well as future forecasts. Some information is also provided regarding upcoming events which may influence commodity prices (such as the impact of climate change, or supply and demand issues).
