Levels of editing – macro level

- Coherence of the overall argument
- Text covers main sections required

How to edit at the macro level:

- ✓ Use mind-mapping techniques
- ✓ Explain the main arguments of your text to a friend
- ✓ Refer to guidelines, have you covered the main sections?
- ✓ Check headings for consistency and clarity
 - ... headings by themselves should convey "story"

Levels of editing – intermediate level

Content (flow of ideas in paragraphs and sentences)

How to edit at the intermediate level:

- ✓ Read out loud
- ✓ Check your paragraphs (refer to GRASP session 4)
- ✓ Summarise your paragraphs into 1 short sentence: check for coherence
- ✓ Use mind-mapping techniques
- ✓ Check your sentence structure (refer to GRASP session 5)

Levels of editing - micro level

• Syntax, grammar, spelling, punctuation, formatting, referencing

How to edit at the micro level:

- ✓ Read out loud
- ✓ Change font and size
- ✓ Hold upside down (for formatting ②)
- ✓ Know your weaknesses and edit accordingly

Editing – tips

- ✓ Check guidelines (for thesis, journal articles, ...)
- ✓ Use style guides
- ✓ Print it out
- ✓ Take a break
- ✓ Edit for one specific element at a time
- ✓ Go from macro to micro editing (big to small)
- ✓ Edit at macro and intermediate level whenever feels right, but proofread (micro level) at the end
- ✓ Come up with your own Edit-To-Do list based on feedback and past errors
- ✓ Use Find-Replace functionality
